Transportation Advocates of Texas Urges Support for Prop 2

Vote **“YES”** on Proposition 2 on November 2.

Texas is growing and the wear-and-tear on our transportation infrastructure is slowing us down as we travel for work and family.

The Texas Legislature passed a bill to place Proposition 2 on the ballot. So this November 2 we get a say in local road and bridge projects.

With nearly half of our state’s roads in bad shape, voters must now decide if they will put safety first by giving counties some of the same tools that cities and towns now have to make vital infrastructure improvements.

A **“YES”** vote on Proposition 2 this November 2 will allow counties to dedicate additional funding to infrastructure and keep Texans safe on the road while reducing time spent in traffic.

Proposition 2 will mean more jobs for our community without any new taxes, no new fees and no new toll roads.

Prop. 2 would allow counties – just like cities have successfully done for years – to create Transportation Reinvestment Zones where new projects can improve underdeveloped areas, creating additional growth in property and sales revenue from making the area more attractive and better for families and local businesses.
